What is it and what should I know?

The US Census is a national nine-question survey to help count the population in the United States.



Everybody in your house counts! This includes newborns, infants, and anybody who sleeps in your home the majority of the time.

Community funds and support to be given by the US Government will be determined by the results and participation of this survey. ***It's very important that we all participate!***

WHAT CAN I EXPECT?

- Starting in **March** every household will receive post cards and letters asking to complete the census. These mailers will include information about how to participate over the phone and online.
- By mid-**April**, printed surveys will be sent to each household that still hasn't completed the survey online or over the phone.
- By mid-**May**, census takers will knock on the door of every household that still hasn't completed the census. If you want, you can ask for a bilingual census taker.
- Not completing the census may lead to a **fine!**
- ***If a census taker knocks on your door, you should ask them to show you their ID. He or she will have an ID with their name, the official seal of the US Census Bureau, and an expiration date.***



One way to prevent a visit from the census taker is to complete the census in March or April.

IS MY PERSONAL INFORMATION SECURE?



Absolutely! Your information is confidential and is protected by the US Constitution. Your responses cannot be shared with any other government agency.

There will not be any questions about citizenship status. You will also never be asked for information like your Social Security number, proof of residency or citizenship, bank account information, etc.

Any other rumors are untrue!
