The U.S. Census arrives in April 2020



Don't forget the kids!

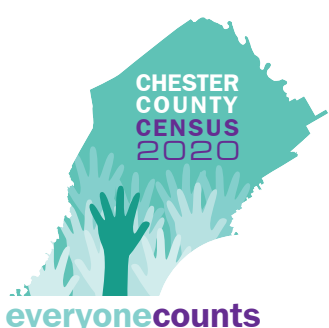
Children need to be counted in the 2020 Census.

- Children, including infants born on or after April 1, 2020, must be included.
- Children who are citizens or non-citizens must be included.
- Children of divorced parents must be included with the parent with whom they spend the most time.
- If there is 50/50 custody, both parents should count their children.
- College students living in dorms must be counted based on where they are residing on April 1, 2020.

In April 2020, every mailing address in the United States will receive a letter from the U.S. Census requesting that you provide the following information:

- How many people are living in your home on April 1, 2020
- Whether your home is owned or rented
- Gender, race, age, ethnic group, and relationship status

Every person in the U.S., both citizens and non-citizens, is required by law to fill out the 2020 Census form, which you can do using a mailed-in form, the U.S. Census webpage, or phoning the Census Bureau. **You will not be asked if you are a U.S. citizen.**
