How to start a Litter Lifter Group in your community







The following **How-To Guide** was created by the **Litter Lifters of West Vincent** - it shares information about how the group was organized and how they hold litter clean ups.

STEPS

Steps 1 thru 11

- 1. Organize a group of people who want to help.
- 2. Create an identity for your group.
- 3. Create a list of supplies you will need.
- 4. Figure out how to get the supplies you need for FREE.

- 5. Find out what local resources are available.
- 6. Meet with your municipality.
- 7. Pick a date!
- 8. Promote your event.
- 9. Prepare for safety.
- 10. Hold your event!
- 11. After the event.





Organize a group of people who want to help.

- Collect emails.
- Call or text friends.
- If you don't know anyone yet, create a Facebook post for your township or local police department to share, and/or another existing group that has members in your area.







Create an identity for your group

- Create a name for your group.
- Secure an email address, if you don't want to use your own.
- Have a volunteer design a logo (not necessary to get something started; but may be nice to have down the road!)







Create a list of supplies you will need

- Trash bags
- Gloves
- Safety vests
- Trash pickers/grabbers





Figure out how to get the supplies you need for FREE

- Contact your local landfill to see if they can provide trash bags, gloves, and/or vests. Both landfills in Chester County provide free trash disposal for volunteer groups.
- Signing up for PennDOT's Adopt a Highway program allows groups to get free supplies from PennDOT, including "Litter Crew Ahead" signs.





Find out what local resources are available

Meet with your municipality

- Let your Municipal Manager/Secretary know about your group and determine if it makes sense for the group to be affiliated with the municipality.
- If associated with the municipality, determine what support they can provide (supplies, police support at roadway cleanup events, promotion through newsletter, social media etc.)





Pick a date!

- Choose a date for your clean-up, and preferably a rain date, too.
- Be sure to have contact information for volunteers in case you need to quickly communicate any change in plans.





Promote your event

- Register your event on **Keep Pennsylvania Beautiful's website**. If the event is part of the Adopt-a-Highway program,
 be sure to post at least a week in advance so PennDOT has
 time to acquire/gather your supplies.
- Create a post for social media, and share to local groups, your municipality's pages, and/or a new page you create for your group. Be sure to include the date, timeframe, parking location, location of clean-up, what to bring/wear, and how to register.



Prepare for safety

- Consider having a liability waiver for volunteers to sign once for the first clean-up (if you keep a file of waivers, it can be valid for all future clean-ups). Email it to volunteers to bring to the event and have copies available at the event.
- Create a safety list for volunteers and ask volunteers to review the document in advance. Also have copies available at events.
- Secure local police support if cleaning up a busy road or if other safety concerns exist.





Hold your event

- Start early, particularly if doing a road clean-up, so there's not too much traffic.
- Ask volunteers to arrive 15 minutes
 before the event starts- use this time to
 go over safety precautions, sign waivers,
 and hand out supplies.
- Keep your event under three hours –
 people are busy, and they will get tired!





Hold your event (continued)

- Keep volunteers close together. If you have a big group, break up into several small groups and assign "Litter Captains". Get the cell phone number of each Litter Captain for easy communication.
- For Adopt-a-Highway clean-ups, securely tie full trash bags closed, and place in a pile near the road where they will be easily visible for PennDOT to pick up, preferably near an intersection.
- Take pictures!
- After the event, thank the volunteers!





After the event

- Post on social media the results of the event where you worked, who helped, and what you accomplished.
- If you provided reusable gloves and/or vests, wash them immediately due to germs, ticks, poison ivy, etc.
- Send an email to volunteers asking for feedback.
